### Respiratory Therapists

As a volunteer Respiratory Therapist at Camp, you will play a large role in ensuring every aspect of Camp can be enjoyed by campers with diagnoses that require onsite respiratory support. You will actively provide care and interventions to those with conditions such as Cystic Fibrosis and Pulmonary Hypertension while at Camp. Whether you are providing an extra dose of oxygen at the Ropes Course or safely transferring campers and their respiratory equipment into a boat; your day is sure to be packed full of fun as you help to create a safe and inclusive environment for all. All medical volunteers must be professionally licensed in California and have at least one year of clinical work experience.

#### Spring & Fall Family Weekends:

Family Weekends are a 3-4 day commitment.

Volunteers arrive Friday afternoon at 1pm and depart Sunday afternoon.

#### Summer Sessions:

Summer Sessions are a 6-7 day commitment.

Volunteers arrive the day before the session begins for training and depart the last day of Camp.
