

Not Your Average Camp Experience

Summer Sessions: Nurses are assigned a cabin of 8-10 campers for the week and are responsible for routine medication administration and care. Nurses and physicians share rotational coverage in the Well Shell as well as safety coverage at designated activity areas. Allied healthcare professionals oversee campers with related needs (i.e. respiratory therapists supervise the nightly routines of campers with respiratory assistive devices and are on-call for any complications). When not performing medical duties, volunteers have free time to hang out with their campers!

Family Weekends: While parents remain the primary caregivers to their children for medications and treatments, the medical team is available for any supportive or urgent care needed. During the course of the weekend, the volunteers share rotational coverage of the camp areas. Nurses and physicians are also encouraged to play an educational role for families who are newly diagnosed.

Lodging: Volunteers stay in a 2-bed, climate controlled room with a private, full bathroom. Medical professionals share a room with another Well Shell team member. Linens and towels are supplied.

- Meals: Three meals are provided daily, including vegetarian and gluten-free options. If you have specific dietary needs, please feel free to bring your own food. The Well Shell team eats with campers and counselors in the Dining Hall.
- **Educational Opportunities:** Summer nurses can earn 16 CEUs by completeing a Camp Education Module. Volunteering is an excellent opportunity to work alongside a diverse team of experienced practicioners from top medical centers.
- **Downtime:** The Painted Turtle is located in the scenic Angeles National Forest, outside Los Angeles. During off-time, volunteers can feel free to soak in the sunshine and enjoy the fresh mountain air.





Camp's onsite, state-of-the-art medical center, the **Well Shell**, is a 6,000 square foot, whimsical environment designed to ensure that children never miss a moment of camp fun. The Well Shell team works together to care for the campers during their stay at The Painted Turtle and provide on-site physician support at all times during camp sessions.

The Painted Turtle serves over 120 medical conditions, including:

- ♥ cerebral palsy ♥ cystic fibrosis ♥ skeletal dysplasia
- hemophilia/Von Willebrand disease
 spina bifida
 Crohn's Disease & ulcerative colitis
- ♥ kidney & liver disease ♥ muscular dystrophy
